FEATURED SPEAKERS



Bill Kreuser, Ph.D.University of Nebraska-Lincoln: Assistant Professor, Extension Turfgrass Specialist

Bill Kreuser, Ph.D., is a turfgrass extension specialist and assistant professor at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. He earned his B.S. and M.S. degrees at University of Wisconsin-Madison and his Ph.D. at Cornell University. Kreuser's research focuses on winter desiccation and spring green-up, iron layer formation in sand putting greens, and nitrogen fertilization management. His appointment at UNL is 60 percent extension and 40 percent research.

Kreuser worked as research manager at UW-Madison, where he developed a GDD model to apply PGRs. During his time at Cornell, he also worked as spray technician at the Robert Trent Jones Golf Course.



John Sorochan, Ph.D.University of Tennessee: Distinguished Professor

A native of Calgary, Alberta, Canada, Dr. John Sorochan began working on the grounds crew at Earl Grey Golf and Country Club in 1988. He received his Ph.D. in Turfgrass Science from Michigan State University in 2002, and is presently a Distinguished Professor of Turfgrass Science and Management in the Plant Sciences Department at the University of Tennessee (UT). Dr. Sorochan is also the Director for the UT Center for Athletic Field Safety.

Dr. Sorochan is responsible for the department's academic turf programs at both the undergraduate and graduate level and teaches several classes in the Turfgrass Science and Management Program. His research program coordinates investigations on environmental turf stress physiology including indirect heat, shade, drought, and wear stress for golf course, sports turf, and commercial and home lawn turf. His research also includes athletic field management, including athletic field performance and safety, athlete to surface interactions, new cultivar and species evaluation for management and use, sustainable strategies for reduced inputs for golf courses, residential turf, and sod production.



Jared Hoyle, Ph.D. Kansas State University: Assistant Professor

Jared Hoyle, Ph.D., is currently an assistant professor and extension turfgrass specialist at Kansas State University. Hoyle earned his bachelor of science in horticulture science in 2006, master of science in crop science in 2009 at North Carolina State University and doctorate in 2012 in agronomy and Soils at Auburn University. He continued conducting turfgrass research as a post-doctoral research associate at the University of Georgia. Hoyle's applied research and extension program focuses on cultural and chemical weed management in turfgrass systems and managing/establishing low input turfgrass systems.



David Gardner, Ph.D.
Ohio State University: Professor

David Gardner, Ph.D., is an associate professor of horticulture at The Ohio State University. He teaches courses in turfgrass management, ornamental plant identification and statistics. His research focuses on turfgrass physiology and weed management.
